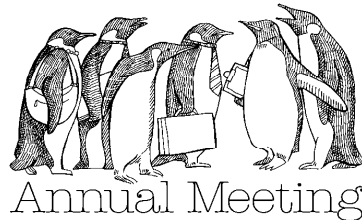

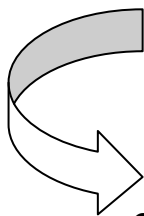

THE INVITATION

Friends, baptism is a special occasion in Christian life when we recognize the grace of God living in each newborn creation. God offers us new life and the miracle of transformation, a continuing process of the renewing of body, mind, and spirit, which takes place within faith communities. So it is that April and Michael now bring their infant daughter into this community of faith to be baptized today. We welcome them with the peace of Christ.

Hear these words of our Lord Jesus:

“All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age.”
(Matthew 28:18-20)

Obedying the word of our Lord, and sure of his presence with us, we baptize those whom God has called to be his own.

In Jesus Christ, God has promised to forgive our sins and has joined us together in the family of faith which is his church. In this family we are received as brothers and sisters of Christ.

Dear friends: know that God's promises are sure. By baptism, God puts his sign on us to show that we belong to him, and gives us Holy Spirit as a guarantee that, sharing Christ's reconciling work, we will also share his victory.

THE PRESENTATION

Elder: On behalf of the Session and with great joy,
I present Bellamy Ann Cranmer, born December 16, 2017
to receive the sacrament of Holy Baptism.

THE QUESTIONS TO THE PARENTS

Pastor: Dear friends, we are pleased that you have chosen this time and place to present your child for baptism. Within this sacrament we re-affirm our faith and give thanks to God, who guards us from evil and nurtures us in love. Having received Bellamy as a precious gift from God, and entrusted with her nurture and care, I ask you now to re-affirm your own faith in Jesus Christ and your willingness to follow him:

1. Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world?
(I do.)
2. Do you acknowledge one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Lord and Savior?
(I do.)
3. Is it your desire for this child to receive the sacrament of baptism and be joined to the whole household of God's children in faith; and is it further your desire that she might grow in knowledge and understanding of Jesus Christ, become his disciple, and come to serve him and to follow where he leads?
(It is.)
4. Will you try, to the best of your ability, to live a Christian life and teach Bellamy the essentials of the faith, leading by example in word and deed; and will you seek the fellowship and nurture of the church as often as you can and wherever you may be?
(I will, with God's help.)

THE QUESTION TO THE CONGREGATION

Elder: Our Lord instructed us to nourish one another in the faith and to pray for each other at all times. Do we, the people of Covenant Presbyterian Church, promise to uphold this child and her family in our prayers, and by our fellowship, to strengthen their ties with the whole household of God?

People: **Yes, we so promise.**

THE PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

Pastor: O God, our loving Father: we thank you for your faithfulness, promised in this sacrament, and for the hope we have in your Son, Jesus, who rose victorious from the grave.

Now put your seal upon this precious child, we pray, and bind her to your household of faith; guard her from all evil; instruct her in your Truth; and guide her to serve you with joy until that day when you make all things new.

O God, as she is baptized with water, baptize Bellamy with your Holy Spirit, so that what we say may be Your Word and what we do may be Your Work. To you be all praise, honor, blessing and glory, now and forever. Amen.

Come forward to greet the Cranmer family

Will the groundhog see his shadow this year?

(Friday, February 2, 2018)



Groundhog Day always falls on February 2nd. This traditionally marks the midpoint between the winter solstice in December and the spring equinox in March. According to legend, if a groundhog sees its shadow on this day, there will be six more weeks of winter; if it doesn't, then spring is right around the corner. Of course, this refers to wintry weather conditions. We like to joke, "If he sees his shadow, we'll have six more weeks of winter; if he doesn't, it'll be six weeks till spring" because, of course, the dates of the equinox do not change.

Groundhog Day has deeper meaning because it speaks to the triumph of spring over winter—and birth over death. Originally, this was a Celtic festival marking the cross-quarter day, or midpoint of the season.

The day was called *Imbolc* (lambs' milk) because the lambing season had just begun. It was also called *Brigantia* for the Celtic female deity of light, calling attention to the Sun being halfway on its advance from the winter solstice to the spring equinox.

The Christian church later called this festival of light, "Candlemas." The English name refers to the candles lit that day in churches to celebrate the presentation of the Christ Child in the temple of Jerusalem. Since the traditional celebration anticipated the planting of crops, a central focus of the festivities was the forecasting of either an early spring or a lingering winter. Sunshine on Candlemas was said to indicate the return of winter. Though we recognize animal behavior isn't the only way to judge planting dates, the tradition continues, often with a wink and a smile.

How often has the groundhog really predicted the coming of spring? According to researchers, the groundhog has accurately predicted the coming of spring only 39 percent of the time (at the time of this writing). No matter what the percentage, it's a fun time had by all!



Rev. John C. R. Silbert
A Biographical Sketch

The Rev. John Charles Reutlinger Silbert was born March 23, 1956 at Phoenixville, PA (Chester County), where John's father, the Rev. William G. Silbert, Jr. served as pastor of the First Presbyterian Church. Three months later on May 27, 1956, Bill and Elizabeth Silbert asked a dear seminary friend, the Rev. Vincent T. Ross, to baptize their youngest son. At the time, Rev. Ross ("Uncle Vince") was pastor of Second Presbyterian Church, Butler.

Pastor John was educated at Gordon College in Wenham, MA (BA in Biblical and Theological Studies, 1978); Princeton Theological Seminary in Princeton, NJ (M. Div. in Practical Theology in 1982); and was admitted to candidacy in the PhD Program in Rhetoric and Communication at the University of Pittsburgh in 1985 (ABD).

Ordained in September 1986, Pastor John has served many congregations in Southwestern Pennsylvania at Covenant PC, Boswell; Pine Run PC, Apollo; Fort Burd PC, Brownsville; Union PC and First PC, Murraysville; the PC of Latrobe; Derry PC; and Westminster PC, Greensburg. From 2003-2016, he was a member of Pittsburgh Presbytery having served Forest Avenue PC, Bellevue, and the Moon Run PC in Robinson Township. In May 2016, John became a member of the Beaver-Butler Presbytery in service as the stated supply pastor of Trinity Presbyterian Church, Butler. Alongside his pastoral service, Pastor John worked for the Presbyterian Media Mission of Pittsburgh, serving as a Consultant and as its Associate Director (1998-2002).

Pastor John has taught at both the collegiate and graduate level at the University of Pittsburgh and the Trinity Episcopal School for Ministry in Ambridge, PA. Since 2003, he has been a continuing member of the adjunct faculty in the School of Communication and Information Systems at Robert Morris University in Moon Township, PA. In his time there, Pastor John has served as a chaplain in the Campus Ministry Association in the Office of Student Life, and as an occasional actor in the RMU Colonial Theatre where he became an honorary member of Alpha Psi Omega, the National Theatre Honorary Society.

Outside of his church and school duties, Pastor John serves on the Baden Academy Charter School Board of Trustees and is a Member of the Board of the Zelienople Historical Society where he serves as secretary. He is a lifelong fly fisherman (50+ years), is an actor in university and community theatre, loves ice hockey, is a Civil War history buff, enjoys choral singing, and plays a really inconsistent game of golf!

Pastor John lives in Zelienople Borough with his beloved wife of six years, Elaine Ann Nucci. Elaine was born and raised in Hudson, NY; educated at Slippery Rock University (BA in Business and Communication, 1984) and Point Park University (MBA in 2009 and MA in Organizational Leadership in 2018); and is advertising sales manager for the Pittsburgh Cultural District. Elaine loves to cook and play tennis (but not at the same time), is a devoted fan of Turner Classic Movies, loves the arts, plays the flute, enjoys singing swing, and joins her husband at RMU hockey games whenever she can.

Between them, Pastor John and Elaine have four adult children: Kate Silbert (Ann Arbor, MI), Hannah Silbert (Salem, Mass.), and Christine and Andrew Weir (Cranberry Twp.)
