This year we observe the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Martin Luther's protest ... considered to be the beginning of the Protestant Reformation.

It is held (traditionally) that on October 31, 1517 Luther posted ninety-five Theses (propositions for debate) concerned with the question of indulgences and other objections to Roman Catholic theology and practice, on the door of the Schlosskirche (Castle Church), Wittenberg, Germany.
